DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Discontinuous and patchy azurite and malachite occurs in coarse, light brown, K-feldspar rich monzonite of Lower Jurassic age. The monzonite is situated in green pyroxene-rich andesite, agglomerate, breccia and minor tuff. The structure in the area trends NW.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located 12 miles W of Likely.

The Mary 1 to 34 and Bell 1 to 6 claims were acquired by Leemac Mines Ltd. from T. McMahon and L. Price, in 1969. Additional claims, the Pat 1 to 24, 27 to 41, 43 to 58, 61 to 63 and Lou 1 to 5, were staked in 1971 to become part of a 104 claim group called the Jack Pine. During this year geochemical and geophysical surveys, and diamond drilling were done. Further geochemical, magnetic and I.P. surveys, and diamond drilling were carried out in 1972.

In 1973, Leemac drilled one hole 500 feet.
