DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Chalcopyrite, bornite, and molybdenite occur on fractures, joints, small faults, and occasionally in small quartz veinlets in a small monzonite intrusion.

Associated minerals or products of value — Molybdenum.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at elevations of 2,000 to 4,000 feet on the south side of Horetzky Creek, 2 miles east of Kemano.

The Pintledanne group of claims was staked on the showings in the spring of 1906 by Messrs. Dakin and Pocklington, of Victoria. No development work was reported at that time.

The Joe 1-14 claims were held in 1968 by United Copper Corporation Limited. Work during the year included a survey of the surface workings, geological mapping, and 310 feet of bedrock trenching.
