DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Perlite appears to be intercalated with light to dark-grey porphyritic rhyolites, but in no instance were the rocks directly overlying or underlying the perlite seam. The perlite is light grey or pale-greenish gray in colour, and in some showings is associated with resinous brown perlitic glass.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The perlite showings are located on the north and west slopes of Dayeezcha Mountain between 3,200 and 3,700 foot elevations; approximately 2 miles south of Uncha Lake.

In July 1953, 42 claims, comprising the Randy 1-8, Jimmy 1-8, National 1-6, Sheila 1-7, Shallamar 1-8, Stewart 1-3 and Willow 1-2, were recorded by Messrs. Powney. Rasmussen, Anderson, et. al. Trenching across the claim group indicated 3 main showings.

Early in 1955, the Perlite Mining Corporation Limited acquired control of a group of twenty-five claims including the Sheila, Jimmy, Randy and Perl groups. The following work was accomplished during that year: mapping and surveying; 19 trenches totalling 11,000 feet; blasting of fourteen rock trenches - averaged 2 feet in depth; collecting of thirty-nine, 50-pound samples for testing.
