DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A number of small veins are exposed in the bed of a creek which cuts a deep gorge in argillite country rock. A well-pyritized andesite dyke occurs in the vicinity of the veins. A sample of one vein showing sulphides failed upon assay to disclose appreciable gold values. A sample of the dyke assayed a trace of gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This occurrence is located on a small tributary of Des Creek which flows into the McLeod River some 75 miles north-northwest of Prince George.

The Syndicate group of mineral claims was owned by W.L. Armstrong and associates of Prince George in 1933. No work was reported at that time.
