Bedrock exposed upstream from the workings is serpentinitized peridotite. As the gold seldom exceeded more than four or five colours a pan, little work was done, but a few nuggets valued at from 50 cents to \$2 have been found.

Van Decar Creek flows northeasterly into the Middle River some 75 miles east-northeast of Smithers. In the thirties a little placer gold was found near the fork of the creek about 2 miles above the mouth.
