DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The rocks in the vicinity are steeply dipping, thinly bedded, dark quartzites and slates of the Takla group, and a younger, dark green, fine grained, massive andesite. A quartz vein 2 feet wide outcrops at the lake edge, extends into the water, and about 20 feet of its length is visible. Fine-grained pyrite and arsenopyrite are disseminated along small fractures in the quartz, and a little galena and sphalerite was noted. An assay of a sample taken across the width of the vein indicated traces of gold and silver.
