DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A short adit cuts a quartz vein 2-3 feet wide, striking northeast, mineralized with galena and sphalerite. A selected sample assayed: Gold, 0.04 ounce a ton; silver, 1.6 ounces a ton; lead, 1.6%; zinc, 2.0%.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This occurrence is located about 1½ miles west of the north-west corner of Tchesinkut Lake, on a hill that rises to about 500 feet above the lake.

In 1925 the property was known as the Cymric. The claims were staked on some slightly mineralized quartz float. A claim, or claims, owned by a Mr. Newman was located on the south side of the hill. The only work reported at that time was a 20 foot long adit on Newman's claim.

The Gamble group, owned in 1929 by W. Cummings, of Calgary, was apparently a relocation of the former claims. The property was under option to F.H. Taylor in 1929; some trenching was reported at that time.
