DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showings occur at the contact of metamorphosed Cache Creek rocks (gneisses, schists, and banded foliated sediments) and a body of Topley diorite, which is intimately intruded by granodiorite. The mineral showings are of several types: (a) pyrite, magnetite, epidote, and glassy quartz, disseminated throughout the metamorphosed Cache Creek rocks and the diorite over areas up to 50 feet in diameter; (b) large irregular lenses of glassy quartz, up to 20 to 30 feet thick and 100 to 200 feet long, carrying minor amounts of pyrite, chalcopyrite, and molybdenite; and (c) quartz veins carrying minor amounts of the same sulphides as the lenses. Available assays show a low content of gold and silver. The disseminated deposits have all the features of typical contact metamorphic deposits, but the quartz veins and lenses contain minerals usually associated with hydrothermal deposits.

This property is located at about the 3,000 foot elevation on the north side of Taltapin Mountain, some 9 miles southwest of the east end of Babine Lake.

Radio Gold Mines, Limited, incorporated in June 1933, carried out exploration work in 2 shafts, pits, and numerous trenches. No work was reported beyond 1934; the company charter was surrendered in 1943.

The showings were restaked in 1966 as the Don group by D.W. Smellie. Geophysical and geochemical surveys were carried out in 1967. The claims subsequently lapsed.
