DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The gold is fine and flaky. It occurs slightly above creek level in a layer of gravel overlying a clay seam 12 to 18 inches thick. A small amount of gold also occurs in rudely stratified glacial gravels that form low terraces along the creek valley. Only the gravels above the clay seam were mined, as gold was not found to occur below in paying quantities. Most of the gold is obtained from around large boulders lying on the clay.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

Dog Creek flows into Stuart River 8 miles south of the east end of Stuart Lake. Gold was discovered in the creek in 1931 and several claims were staked, but only a small amount of mining was done. The claim on which most of the gold was found is on a small, flat area lying a short distance downstream from where the creek has cut through glacial drift 60 feet thick.

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION/HISTORIQUE DE LA PRODUCTION

Recorded production during the period 1931-1940 totals 105 ounces of placer gold.
