DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

As described in 1926, the Solo main showing consists of a silicified seam a few inches wide following the bedding of the enclosing andesite, and mineralized with sphalerite, and a little chalcopyrite and pyrite. A selected sample assayed: gold, 0.3 ounce per ton; silver, 2.2 ounces per ton; zinc, 26.5%.

Associated minerals or products of value - Silver, gold.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The Solo claim was reported to be located "on the north-east slopes of Grouse Mountain overlooking Fish Lake". Its location relative to subsequent staking in the East Lode group is uncertain. Grouse Mountain is located 16 miles southeast of Telkwa.

The Solo claim was owned in 1926 by L.H. McLean.

The East Lode 1-4 claims were owned in 1970 by M. Chapman, of Smithers; geological mapping was reported.
