DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A shear zone is exposed in volcanic rocks on the side of a small basin at an elevation of 5,650 feet. The zone strikes north 15 degrees west, ranges from 6 to 12 inches in width, and carries a little pyrite, galena, and chalcopyrite. A hand specimen of the ore collected from an open-cut assayed: gold, 0.08 ounce a ton; silver, 8.1 ounces a ton. Another sample taken from the same vein higher up on the bluff, assayed: gold, 0.08 ounce a ton; silver, 5.2 ounces a ton; lead, 3.2 per cent; and copper, 0.75 per cent.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at the 5,500 foot elevation on the southeast shoulder of Hudson Bay Mountain, on the left side of Pine Creek.

The showings were held in 1911 by the Miller Brothers as the Groundhog and Cariboo claims.
