DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

"At the precipitous western edge of this plateau, at the upper edge of Loring basin, there is exposed a mineralized band of rock about 20 feet in width, which strikes N45°E (mag.) and dips at 65° southeast. This shows at the upper edge of Loring basin a good mineralization of chalcopyrite. What is apparently the continuation of this mineralized band can be traced across the plateau and possibly extends to the upper edge of the Big Toboggan glacier. This band is about 1,000 feet or so south of the shaft previously mentioned." (Lay, 1928).

Lay locates the showing relative to the main showing on which a shallow shaft was sunk and which subsequently proved to be on the Silver Lake property.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the west side of Hudson Bay Mountain, near the head of Silvern Creek, 9 miles north-west of Smithers. The Silver Lake property (93 L/14, AG 4) adjoins to the north and east.

A group of 9 claims, including the Bonanza, Highland Chief, and Enterprise, was staked in this vicinity by a Mr. Loring and the Hankin Brothers, of Hazelton, in about 1905. In 1916 it was reported that open cutting and stripping had been done in the gulch in which the Bonanza showings are exposed.

The Trade Dollar group, comprising the Trade Dollar and Trade Dollar 1-3 claims, was staked in 1928 by Angus and Alex Chisholm and E. Hassard, adjoining the Silver Lake property. The main showing, at elevation 6,650 feet, was found by a 1929 survey to be on the Silver Lake property. Douglas Lay (1928), describes another showing about 1,000 feet to the south, "at the upper edge of Loring basin", which may be the old Bonanza showing.
