		HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT The property is located at the 4,500 foot elevation on the east side of Driftwood Creek, 11 miles northeast of Smithers. The Pack-Train group of 3 claims was staked by C.G. Harvey in 1905. Exploration and development work to 1909 was done in open cuts, a 35 foot shaft, and 41 feet of adit. No further activity was reported until about 1916 when Mr. Harvey and associates resumed work on the Harvey group of 5 claims, including the Winter and Summer claims. Small ship- ments of hand sorted ore were made in subsequent years. An inclined shaft was sunk 65 feet on the upper vein. At a point 25 feet down the shaft a drift was run 20 feet on the vein and a short winze put down. From the drift and winze an irregular stope was developed. In 1921 the property was optioned to an Edmonton syndicate. A crosscut adit was begun and by 1924 had been driven to a length of 233 feet. The crosscut adit was extended to a length of 392 feet. At 264 feet from the portal a drift was driven 70 feet northeast. The option was given up in 1929. Some further work was done by R.L. Gale of Smithers in 1930. J.J. Herman shipped samples from the Harvey property to the Dept. of Mines Sampling Plant at Prince Rupert in 1940. Driftwood Mines Ltd. in August 1970 optioned the Summer and Winter claims from Gordon Harvey of Smithers. The adjacent Drift 1-14 and 25-32 claims were purchased from prospector Lloyd Hodgson of Smithers in November 1970. Addi- tional claims Drift 15-24 and 33-40 were staked by the company. Limited trenching, soil sampling and line cutting was carried out during 1971-72.					

HISTORY OF PRODUCTION

During the period 1917-1927, 25 tons of sorted ore were shipped from this property. From this ore 4,269 ounces of silver and 10,385 pounds of copper were recovered.
