## **DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT**

PRODUCT

The mineral occurrence consists of a shear-zone in porphyritic andesite in the near vicinity of an intrusion of granodiorite. The shear-zone is between 4 and  $4\frac{1}{2}$  feet in width and can be traced for many hundreds of feet along its strike of N10°W (mag.). The dip is to the southwest at 63°. The gangue is quartz and country-rock, sparsely mineralized with copper pyrites, galena, zinc-blende, and copper-stain. The country-rock on the hanging-wall side of the vein is altered for a width of from 50 to 75 feet. A sample of selected mineral from the first-mentioned shaft assayed: Gold, trace; silver, 0.4 oz. to the ton; zinc, 4.5 per cent. On the north-east side of this shear-zone at various points up to elevation 5,025 feet are exposed some other veins consisting largely of quartz, sparingly mineralized with small amounts of galena, zinc-blende, and chalcopyrite.

#### HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at about the 5,500 foot elevation on the east side of Driftwood Creek, 12 miles northeast of Smithers. The claims lie east of and adjoining the Harvey property.

The Home group, comprising the Peacehaven, Happy Home, Fairhaven, Sanctuary Fr., Pleasant Valley, Enchanted Vale, and Triangle Fr. claims, was owned by R.L. Gale and H.C. Lifton during 1928-29. Exploration work was done in open cuts and a 20 foot shaft.
