HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at elevations of 3,500 to 4,000 feet about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile southeast of Winninyik Hill, 19 miles south of Houston.

The Winn group of 40 claims was held in 1972 by Maharaja Minerals, Limited. A geochemical soil and sediment survey covering Winn 7-9, 16-20, and trenching on Winn 1-6, 7-16 was carried out.

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The property is underlain largely by Upper Cretaceous Tip Top Hill andesite and dacite volcanic rocks. The property is centered on some old trenches which display veinlets of pyrite, sphalerite, and galena mineralization. Zinc bearing veins were discovered about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile southwest of the original showings by Government geologists.
