DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The underlying rocks are andesitic volcanics and geophitic argillites. On the Peacock claim a narrow seam of quartz and copper sulphides a few inches in width strikes N65°E (mag.). A sample of mineralization from a dump at the collar of the shaft assayed 0.06 ounce gold and 116 ounces of silver per ton, and 10.1% copper. On the Black Hawk group the andesitic volcanics are locally sheared, and slightly mineralized with pyrite and chalcopyrite. A selected sample from near the collar of the shaft assayed 0.04 ounce gold and 2.4 ounces silver per ton, and 0.8% copper.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at about the 4,000 foot elevation on Peacock Creek, 9 miles south-southwest of Houston.

The Peacock showings were staked originally by C.P. Price, apparently in about 1920 or earlier, and a shallow shaft was sunk at that time. In 1929 the ground was restaked as the Peacock group by J. Fraser. The Copper King group, adjoining upstream, was staked by J. Quinn and M. Morrison. The Black Hawk group, located on a tributary creek at about the 4,600 foot elevation, was staked by Frank Madigan. Prospecting and limited exploration work continued in the early 1930's and included a short adit and shallow shaft on the Black Hawk group.
