DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT Outcropping along the Bulkley River near Seaton is a series of sedimentary rocks containing Upper Cretaceous or Tertiary plant remains. These rocks consist of greywacke, shale, and conglomerate, and contain seams of bituminous coal. They strike northwest and dip 30° northeast. The main seam (No. 1) is reported to be $4\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide, split by bands of shale. Nos. 2 and 3 seams are 17 inches and 3 feet wide, respectively. Several other seams have been found in the area. The coal ranks as medium volatile bituminous. The seams are too small and contain too high a percentage of ash to have much commercial value.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The coal seams that have been developed all occur on the west bank of the Bulkley River, beginning about 400 yards south of Seaton. Development work was carried out by the Wright Coal Company, Limited, in 1916 and the Bulkley Valley Coal Mines Syndicate in 1927. Seam No. 1 was opened up by a 275 foot drift from the river level: seams Nos. 2 and 3 have been drifted on for 15 and 70 feet, respectively.
