## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

An argillic and siliceously altered rhyolite is cut by mineralized breccia zones. Pyrite is present up to 20 per cent when associated with calcite.

### HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located between elevations of 1.300 and 2,000 feet along Bulkley Canyon at the mouth of Porphyry Creek, 10 miles southeast of New Hazelton.

The Orbi group of 88 claims was held by Utah Construction and Mining Co. Work during 1967 included geological mapping, an induced potential survey over 13 line-miles. an electromagnetic survey over 2 line-miles, a magnetometer survey over 16 line-miles, a geochemical soil survey over 19 line-miles, and 1,959 feet of diamond drilling in 3 holes. In 1968 a geochemical soil survey was carried out over an area 5,000 by 1,800 feet. Further exploration work in 1970 included geological mapping, induced potential and electromagnetic surveys over 10 line-miles, and 1.058 feet of diamond drilling in 2 holes.
