DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The showings consist of a number of narrow quartz veins, 6 to 10 inches wide, filling fissures in sediments. The veins carry bunches of pyrite and arsenopyrite that in concentrated samples carry up to 0.70 ounce of gold a ton.

This occurrence is located at about the 5,100 foot elevation on the south slope of Sidina Mountain, 12½ miles north-northeast of Hazelton.
