DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The sedimentary rocks are intruded at several points by small stocks of granodiorite and finely crystalline granodiorite dykes. The latter are sheared in a N20°E (mag) direction and in places contain disseminated chalcopyrite, but there is no indication of appreciable continuity. One such dyke, on the east side of the basin at elevation 5,660 feet, is mineralized across a width of 5 feet, of which a width of 2 feet is well mineralized. A sample at this point across 2 feet is reported to have assayed: gold, 0.05 ounce a ton; silver, 1.4 ounces a ton; copper, 7.1%.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This copper occurrence is located in the basin at the head of the east fork of Natlan Creek, about 2 miles west of the summit of Thoen Mountain and some 24 miles east-northeast of Hazelton. This ground, as far as is known, was not staked but was apparently prospected in the 1920's by the owners of the nearby True Fissure and O.K. properties.
