## DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Rock outcrops only at the southwest end of the property. Here a porphyry intrusion has hornfelsed the surrounding Bowser sedimentary rocks and is contained in a large pyrite halo. Some copper minerals have been found in boulders.

## HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located about 5 miles north-northwest of French Peak, some 33 miles east-northeast of Hazelton.

The French group of 20 claims was held by Kennco Explorations (Western), Limited, in 1966. Work during the year included the drilling of one hole 105 feet deep on the French No. 20 claim.

The RO 1-66 claims were held in 1971 by Canadian Superior Exploration Limited. A geochemical soil survey, 410 samples covering all the claims, was carried out.
