**Molybdenite with quartz in small widely separated fractures in granodiorite.**

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property is located at about the 5,000 foot elevation on the southwest side of Netalzul Mountain about 23 miles east of Hazelton.

Twin Peak Mines, Ltd., carried out an airborne electromagnetic survey over the area in 1969. The Daisy 1-38 claims were purchased from Whitesail Mines Ltd. in 1970. An addition 72 Daisy claims were staked about a mile to the southeast to cover several small electromagnetic anomalies. Work during 1970 and 1971 included airborne and ground magnetic and electromagnetic surveys.
