DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

"A quartz zone on Manson River near Discovery Bar is 12 feet wide, and occurs in sheared andesite along a subsidiary fault. It consists of parallel stringers of quartz $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{1}{2}$ inch wide separated from one another by $\frac{1}{4}$ - to 1-inch layers of wall-rock. The sulphides are in the quartz stringers. A grab sample assayed 1.58 per cent lead, 0.49 per cent zinc, 1.32 ounces of silver and 0.005 ounce of gold a ton. A 4-foot vein sparsely mineralized with galena and pyrite occurs in carbonate rock near this quartz zone." (Armstrong, 1949).
