DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

At Ah Hoo Creek, a belt of serpentine quite well mineralized with pyrrhotite is cut by the Germansen River. A sample of this rock assayed: gold, trace; nickel, 0.18%. Below this point the placer deposits of the Germansen River usually contain small amounts of platinum.
