DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Bedded to massive, grey to black limestones with grey, finely grained dolomitic lenses and white-cream coarsely grained dolomitic breccias are overlain by grey slates. The mineralization consists of disseminated light sphalerite with minor galena and pyrite in dolomite breccia near the limestone-slate contact.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located approximately 9 miles north of Germansen Landing.

The Sheila 1-48 claims, owned by Douglas Stelling of Fort St. James, was under option to S.E.R.E.M. Ltd. Work during 1973 and 1974 included geological mapping, and geochemical soil surveys comprising 836 soil and 14 rock samples.
