DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Pyrite and chalcopyrite occur as disseminations and along calcite fracture fillings associated with hornblende porphyry dykes cutting andesitic and basaltic tuffs, breccias, and flows. Mineralization is estimated to grade 0.15 per cent copper over limited areas.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at the 3,300 foot elevation a mile south of Witch Lake and 40 miles south of Manson Creek.

The Camp 1-52 claims, owned by Campbell & Campbell, of Vanderhoof, were optioned in 1970 to Imperial Oil Enterprises Ltd. Work during 1970-1971 included magnetometer surveys over 37 line-miles, an induced potential survey over 5 line-miles, a geochemical soil survey (98 samples), trenching, and diamond drilling totalling 1,500 feet in 3 holes on Camp 2 claim, the option was subsequently dropped.
