DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The area is underlain by the Lower Cretaceous Gething Formation, comprising fine to medium grained sandstone, shale, clay, ironstone, siltstone, and coal. The area is on the western limb of the northwesterly trending Dunbury syncline; dips in the area are in the range of 10 degrees to 25 degrees northeast. A number of relatively thin medium volatile bituminous coal seams occur in the Gething Formation.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the east flank of Mount Gething, between Gaylard Creek and Lake Williston.

Trend Exploration Limited, a company incorporated in Colorado, held coal licences east of Mount Gething in 1970. Geological mapping was reported.

Utah Mines Ltd. in 1972 held CL Nos. 1651-1678 on the east flank of Mount Gething. Work included diamond drilling in 2 HQ size holes totalling 1,474 feet. In 1973 one HQ size hole to a depth of 750 feet was drilled on CL 1670.
