DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The claims are underlain entirely by the Hogem batholith consisting here mainly of monzodiorite, but containing segregations of appinite and hornblende in discordant relationships. Pyrite, chalcopyrite, molybdenite, and bornite occur as blebs and smears in quartz veins and disseminated in the wallrock. Two copper occurrences are shown on Map 1030 A in this vicinity.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located on the west side of the head of Tenakihi Creek approximately 41 miles northwest of Germansen Landing.

The Gail 1-70 and Gail 4-21, 27, 28 Fractions were held in 1973 by Noranda Exploration Company, Limited. Work included a geochemical survey comprising 40 soil samples, and 30 composite rock samples taken from talus slopes above the cirque floor covering Gail 3, 5, 19-22, and Gail 6 and 13 Fractions.
