Disseminated pyrite and chalcopyrite occur in Takla volcanics, and porphyries of the Omineca intrusions.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
The property is located on the southeast side of the
Findlay River, 13 miles northeast of Thutade Lake.

Kennco Explorations (Western), Limited acquired the Pine 1-134 claims and in 1968 carried out geological mapping, and geochemical soil and silt surveys. During 1969 work included trenching, diamond drilling (81 feet) in 1 hole, and further geological and geochemical surveys. Magnetometer and geochemical surveys were carried out in 1970. By 1971 the property had been reduced to 54 claims; work during the year included a magnetometer survey over 8 line-miles, and an induced potential survey over 7 line-miles. In 1973 an airborne magnetic survey was carried out over 97 line-miles of which 23 line-miles were within the claim boundaries.
