DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A large deposit of specular hematite, samples of which are said to assay 60% iron, has been reported. Douglas Lay in his 1934 report on the placer deposits in the vicinity of McClair Creek and the Toodoggone River noted the presence of a large quantity of magnetite and a lesser amount of specularite in the glacial drift of that area. The ice sheet flowed southeasterly in that area.

In 1940 prospector T.S. Thompson, while prospecting for Walter Wilson of Burns Lake, reportedly discovered an iron occurrence some distance north of Metsantan Lake. Mr. Thompson is reported to have done further prospecting on the occurrence in 1942.
