HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located between elevations of 4,400 and 5,900 feet approximately 2 miles west of Oxide Peak and 10 miles southwest of Chukachida Lake.

The Was 1-32 and adjacent claims were owned by Sumac Mines Ltd. During 1972 geological mapping, a magnetometer survey over 9.1 line-miles, an induced potential survey over 7.6 line-miles, a geochemical soil survey (306 samples), and trenching on Was 23 was carried out. Further work in 1973 included ground magnetometer and time domain induced potential surveys over 22 line-miles and a geochemical soil and rock sample survey (172 samples).

OWNER OR OPERATOR AND ADDRESS

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Rocks on the property mainly comprise andesites, tuffs, and agglomerates which strike northwesterly and dip northeasterly at 35 to 45 degrees. A few basaltic dykes cut the andesitic formation. Mineralization appears to lie in a series of fractured or sheared zones trending northwesterly and dipping 50 degrees to the southwest. They contain galena, sphalerite, and pyrite.

Associated minerals or products of value - **Zinc.**
