The showing consists of a quartz vein, up to 30 inches in width, mineralized with pyrite and chalcopyrite. It is located a few miles east of the large body of granodiorite that extends north from the vicinity of Fishing Lakes.

Spinel Creek flows southerly into the Finlay River about 95 miles northwest of Fort Grahame.
