DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT The showings occur on the southwestern side of a northwesterly trending ridge that is largely underlain by limestone and calcareous slates striking N40°W. The rocks are closely folded. A large quartz vein strikes about parallel with the surrounding rocks and dips steeply to the southwest. The vein is at least 5,000 feet long and though exposures are not continuous, appears to vary in width from a few feet to possibly 100 feet or more. The vein appears to be a zone of numerous narrow reticulating quartz veinlets which have partly or completely silicified the host rock. In places there may be 25 feet or more of quartz; in others the same width may consist of numerous narrow quartz veinlets in rock that is only partly silicified. Pyrite and chalcopyrite mineralization occurs in the vein at points several thousand feet apart horizontally. At the northwest end of the showings an assay across 6 feet of a better mineralized section gave: gold, trace; silver, trace; copper, 2.9%. HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

This property is located at the 5,000 foot elevation on the north side of Pesika (Wedge) Creek, a westerly flowing tributary of the Finlay River, between the two largest north forks of the creek.

The Wedge and Protection groups of claims were located on the showings in about 1930 by Mort Teare & Associates of Prince George. The showings were prospected for several years by means of open cuts and short adits.

The showings were restaked in 1941 by E.F. Williams, Mort Teare, and associates as the Copper King group of 6 claims. In 1951 the property consisted of the Copper King Nos. 1 to 8 claims held by Carl Noel, and the Extension Nos. 1 and 2 claims held by Mort Teare. Exploration work to this date consists of open cuts, and some 120 feet of drifts and crosscuts in 3 adits.
