### DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Quartz-carbonate veins containing chalcopyrite. Vein exposures on surface and underground suggest that the northerly trending veins are very irregularly mineralized, discontinuous, and truncated to the south by a system of branching diabase dykes.

This property is located on the west side of a north branch of Delano Creek, a tributary of the Racing River about 100 mile west-southwest of Fort Nelson.

The Lady Luck 1-12 and Loli 1 and 2 claims were acquired by Largo Mines Ltd. During 1969 approximately 1,000 feet of under ground exploratory drift and crosscuts were driven in an adit a the 5.800 foot elevation. In 1970 a raise from the drift was driven up the vein 258 feet through to the surface.
