### OWNER OR OPERATOR AND ADDRESS

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT The mineralization occurs as dyke-like sulphide-rich masses of magnetite, pyrrhotite, pyrite, and chalcopyrite. It appears to be a metasomatic replacement along steep northerly striking fault or fracture zones within the Karmutsen Formation. Open cuts traced the mineralization for 200 feet. The mineralization. where exposed in the adit, had a width of 8 feet. Assays gave values of  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent copper with traces of gold and silver.

Associated minerals or products of value - Iron, gold, silver.

# HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showings, discovered in 1906 by R.J. Leckie, are located one-half mile south of Collison Bay at an elevation of 280 feet.

An adit was driven in 1907 for 33 feet; at 21 feet it cut obliquely a four-foot zone of pyrrhotite containing values in copper, gold and silver. Mr. Leckie and associates in 1908 bonded 3 claims, the Meal Ticket, Treasure Vault, and Cash Box (Treasure Box), to the Tretheway Bros., but no development work was reported at that time. The claims were held from 1910 by Moresby Island Mines, Ltd., although there is no record of this company as a Canadian incorporation. The Meal Ticket (Lot 2011 G 1) and Cash Box (Lot 2012) were Crown-granted to the company in 1914. It was reported in 1915 that the Treasure Vault claim had been Crown-granted to Collision Bay Mining Company, Limited.

The Meal Ticket group, consisting of the Meal Ticket, Treasure Box, and Treasure Vault claims, was owned from about 1918 to 1926 by George D. Scott, of Vancouver. No work was reported during this period.
