DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

PRODUCT

The rocks of the area are of the Vancouver Group, locally represented by the Karmutsen and Kunga Formations, both early Triassic in age. The Karmutsen Formation is a thick accumulation of submarine basic lavas, related clastic rocks, dykes, sills and minor limestone. These are conformably overlain by Kunga limestones and argillites.

The Blue Belle showing is a small pipe-like lens of magnetite with minor garnet striking northwest and dipping nearly vertically at the contact between limestone, possibly the Kunga, and Karmutsen greenstone. The main lens on the surface is about 40 feet long and 5 to 15 feet wide.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This property consists of one Crown-granted claim, Lot 80. covering 14.78 acres. It is located at 800 feet elevation about harbour on the southwest of Harriet Harbour on the southeast coast of Moresby Island. It has commonly been called the Dingo although this is actually a separate showing and claim. It is part of a large group of claims originally held by J.S. McMillan (see Copper Queen, 103 B/6, Cu 3).

The showing was probably discovered around 1906 and was Crown-granted to McMillan in 1909. In 1960 Silver Standard Mines Limited drilled seven EX holes totalling 554 feet,outlining 15,000 tons grading 60% iron. Some geophysical work was also done.

Jedway Iron Ore Limited acquired the property in 1961.
