DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

A stockwork of irregular quartz stringers with occasional veinlets up to 8 inches wide contains erratically distributed stibnite with some chalcopryrite, galena, and some precious metals. The country rock is either highly altered porphyritic andesites of the Yakoun Formation or altered diorites.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showings are at about the 500 foot elevation in the bottom of a steep south-flowing tributary of Riley Creek. The showings were originally reported in 1918 and were staked in 1942 by V. Courte when it received some examination and a little channel sampling.
