DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Magnetite occurs in Paleozoic schists of the Prince Rupert formation. The bedding and the schistosity are coincidental at this location. These rocks are cut by fine-grained granitic dykes. The magnetite occurs as small discontinuous massive bands and comparatively small irregularly distributed lenticular massive lenses.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is situated in Stuart anchorage, on the east coast of the northerly end of Pitt Island, about 35 miles south of Prince Rupert. The main outcrop occupies a small ridge which rises abruptly from the shore to an elevation of about 100 feet.

The claim group was owned by Mathew Kertz, up until 1930. During this time several trenches were cut across the ore zone by the owner. In 1930 ownership was transferred to Canadian and Oriental Mining and Exporting Corporation Limited. No record of any assessment work done by this company is available.
