The property is located 2 miles north of Cumshewa at an elevation of 1,000 feet.

The Bella 1 to 24 and Marino 1 to 18, owned by E. Specogna, were optioned by Union Miniere Explorations and Mining Corporation Limited in 1974. Work consisted of surface geological mapping, a magnetometer survey of 28 line-miles, and topographic mapping. Geochemical soil, stream sediment, and rock surveys of 28 line-miles were carried out which included 549 samples from the Bella claims and 317 samples from the Marino claims. Surface diamond drilling of two holes totalling 481 feet on Bella 4 and trenching for a total for 75 feet were carried out.

DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

Rhyolite, rhyolite porphyry and breccia, dacite and andesite of the Jurassic Yakoun Formation contain disseminations and stringers of pyrite, arsenopyrite, and stibnite.
