DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The country rock formation is mainly quartz diorite of the Coast batholith (Upper Jurassic age) in which a shear zone up to 10 feet in width has been partially replaced by quartz mineralized with pyrite and carrying gold and silver values, and similar in every way to the Belmont-Surf Inlet showings.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

This group was owned by F. Wells in 1921. The property is located on the steep side of the precipitous mountain which stands just north of the point where Paradise creek enters Bear Lake, at an approximate elevation of 2,000 feet.

During the years 1920-21, Mr. Wells' work mainly involved driving a drift adit for over 300 feet, just below the surface showing. He also did some surface stripping.
