DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The showing is a pyritized quartz vein from 6-10 feet wide, striking N10°W and dipping 54°NE, in a schist formation. The vein is traceable on the surface for over 1,000 feet.

Only low values in gold have been obtained.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showing is located about 2 miles north of Swanson Bay, at an approximate elevation of 600 feet.

The showing was owned by J. Plattenberger, of Swanson Bay, prior to the 1920's. Considerable surface work was done on the showings and a 160 foot crosscut adit was driven.

In 1923 the showing was restaked by E.H. Crawford as the Millbank Group, consisting of the Millbank, Clawhammer, Pie, Golden Ore, Big Slide, and Slide Two claims. During 1924 the crosscut adit was extended to a length of about 400 feet, cutting the vein at a depth of 310 feet below the surface. The Summit claim was staked, possibly covering in part the Big Slide and Slide Two claims.
