DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT

The deposit consists of bunches and veinlets of chalcopyrite with some pyrite and sparse molybdenite, occurring in slightly sheared zones of hornblende bands in granite. Alteration products of epidote and garnet and a slight silicification accompany the mineralization.

Associated minerals or products of value - Molybdenum.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showings are situated opposite Butedale on the south side of Butedale bay, off Fraser reach, about 90 miles south of Prince Rupert.

This property consisted of the Bute and Bute No. 2 claims, owned in 1930 by A. Lund and G. Knutson, of Butedale.

In an open cut made in 1930, about 15 feet above high-tide mark, a width of about 2 feet well mineralized with chalcopyrite was exposed. Twelve inches of this should run about 7% copper. No tracing back from the shore was done.
