DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The main vein occurs in granodiorite of the Upper Cretaceous or later Coast Intrusions about 50 feet from the contact with Upper Jurassic and (?) Lower Cretaceous Bowser Group sediments, mainly greywacke and argillaceous quartzite. A second parallel vein occurs in the sediments about 125' from the main vein.

The main vein strikes N40'E (mag.) and dips 55°NW. Its average width is 12" and it has been traced for over 300'. The vein filling is quartz mineralized with pyrrhotite, galena, sphalerite and arsenopyrite. A channel sample across a 7" vein width exposed in a trench assayed: gold, 0.16 oz/t; silver, 5.04 oz/t.

The second vein where exposed for only a few feet is about 75% arsenopyrite and 25% quartz. A sample across its 7" width assayed: gold, 0.20 oz/t; silver, 0.36 oz/t.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located some 23 miles northwest of Terrace and 5 miles west of the north end of Kitsumkalum Lake. The showings are at approximately 2,500' elevation on the ridge between Kitsumkalum (Beaver) River and Mayo Creek (Little Beaver River).

The showings were held as the Fisher group from 1918 or earlier by Matt Allard. In 1922 the claims were sold to a Mr. Hore, of Seattle. A small Ross type mill was taken to the property but not set up. By 1925 the Fisher group of 4 claims was adjoined on the south by the Glen No. 1 claim which was in contact on its south edge with the Brian Boru group of 4 claims. At that time the claims were owned by W. Treston and associates of Terrace and under option to the Hooper-Davis Syndicate. Considerable trenching was done and in 1926 a crosscut adit was driven 173' to the vein, which was drifted on for 15'; the vein consisted of only a few inches of barren quartz. Mr. Treston held adjacent ground as the Marten (Martin) group of claims from 1922 until 1928 or later.

The ground was held in 1967 as the Rex group of 6 claims and in 1970 as the Noble group of 15 claims by Steve Piskulski, of Terrace. In 1967 a 10' pit was put down on No. 4 vein and 26' of crosscut adit was driven.
