DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Map 1136 A indicates the contact between Bowser sedimentary rocks on the north and Coast Intrusions to the south in this vicinity. Underlying rocks are sedimentary, intruded by numerous dykes. Pyrite is widely disseminated in both rock types. On the west side of the divide a silicified zone about 6' wide occurs in sedimentary rock. On the hanging-wall of this is a quartz vein about 8 inches thick, well mineralized with chalcopryite. The remainder of the zone is more or less mineralized with pyrite and chalcopryite. Another showing along the divide shows a fairly well-defined vein of brecciated quartz and country rock, mineralized with galena, zinc-blende, and chalcopryite.

On the east side of the divide an open cut exposes a zone 8 to 10' wide containing stringers of pyrite and small amounts of chalcopryite. A 5-foot sample from the centre of the vein, including a few inches of heavy sulphide, assayed: gold, 0.54 oz/t; silver, 4 oz/t; copper 0.5 per cent.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT  
HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located some 17 miles north of Terrace. The showings lie across the summit of a 4,500' elevation pass between the heads of the north forks of Maroon and Fiddler Creeks. The Log Cabin claims were on the west side of the divide and the Scenic claim on the east side.

The property consisted of up to 8 claims, owned by John Garland, of Terrace from 1921 or earlier. Assessment work continued into 1931 and included trenching, an 80' adit on the west side of the divide, and about three short adits on the east side.
