DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

Sedimentary rocks of the Bowser Group (Upper Jurassic and (?) Lower Cretaceous) are cut by a series of granitic dykes. On the south side of the cirque a quartz vein traceable for at least 500 feet on the very steep side-hill cuts across the sedimentary rocks. The vein strikes north 35 degrees east and dips 50 degrees to the south-east into the hill. Widths up to 30 inches were observed and the average of parts which could be examined is about 2 feet. The narrowest exposure is at the northeastern end, where the vein is 4 inches wide. Parts of the vein are well mineralized with sulphides, including pyrite, chalcopyrite, galena, and arsenopyrite. No gold is visible, but fine gold can be panned readily in a stream flowing from the northeastern end of a small glacier covering the higher part of the vein outcrop. An assay across a 20 inch width of vein 500' from its northeast end gave 0.36 oz/t gold and 5.40 oz/t silver.

The property is located at the 4,500' elevation on the south fork of Carpenter Creek, some 19 miles north-northeast of Terrace.

The Warrior 1-3 claims were recorded in 1944 and the Warrior 4 and 5 in 1945 by John Creagh, holder of a grubstake under the "War-time Prospectors Grubstake Act". The Gold Dome property (103 I/16, AU 6), was located by Creagh that same year.
