DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A 6' wide shear zone strikes southeast and dips steeply southwest in diorite of the Coast Intrusives. The shear contains quartz stringers that are generally sparsely mineralized with pyrite, chalcopyrite, chalcocite, galena and tetrahedrite. A sample across 1.5 feet of vein matter assayed 0.02 oz/t gold and 71 ozs/t silver.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The showings are located at elevations of 4,200' to 4,900' about a mile south of the South Fork-Mid Fork junction of Legate Creek, some 21 miles northeast of Terrace.

The Regina group, comprising the Regina, Hunter and Pacific claims, was owned by J. Brown and J. Smith and associates from 1917 or earlier. Trenching was reported. In subsequent year the owners of the Halliday property (AG 10) claimed they owned the ground on which the Regina claim was located. Trenching on the Hunter and Pacific claims was reported in 1919. Assessment work was continued until 1925 or later and included a short crosscut adit that stopped short of the vein.

The Grey Copper claim, owned in 1925 by Smith and Jordan, was apparently located in this vicinity.

Carl Creek Gold Mining Ltd acquired the Tom 1 claim in this vicinity in 1981. In June 1981 the company entered a joint venture agreement with Claude Resources Inc to explore the property, which includes the Zona May showings (103 I/9, AG 7). The company name (Carl Creek Gold) was changed in August 1981 to Carl Creek Resources Ltd.
