### DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The property is underlain by Jurassic Hazelton Group volcanic rocks intruded by quartz diorite dykes. Two parallel quartz veins strike at right angles to one of the dykes. One of these veins varies in width from 3" to 7" over a length of 40'. It is mineralized with about 3% sulphide, chiefly pyrite, chalcopyrite and tetrahedrite. A 7" channel sample across the vein assayed: Gold, 0.02 oz/t; silver, 4.38 oz/t; copper, 1.24%. The second vein where exposed is only 5" wide but the quartz is well mineralized with chalcocite and tetrahedrite. A 5" channel sample across it assayed: Gold, 0.02 oz/t; silver, 38.18 oz/t; copper, 7.66%.

### HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT HISTORIQUE DE L'EXPLORATION ET DE LA MISE EN VALEUR

The property is located at 4,800° elevation on the south end of a ridge between the heads of Chimdemash Creek and North Kleanza Creek, some 19 miles northeast of Terrace.

The Silver Horde group of 4 claims was owned by J.D. Wells and A. Roark from 1920 or earlier. Limited work was done in open cuts. From 1924 the property was known as the Silver Crown group. In that year the claims were optioned by J. Willman for Seattle interests but no work was reported. The owners carried out assessment work in 1925.

Sultana Silver Mines Limited in 1971-72 held the Silver Basin property (AG 13) and an "adjacent property", possibly the Silver Crown. Work in 1971 on the adjacent property included geophysical and geochemical surveys and 1,000' of diamond drilling.
