The area is underlain by Jurassic Hazelton Group volcanics. A sample from an open cut on a "quartzose rock with banded structure" reportedly yielded \$4/ton in gold (circa 1914).

The Copper Dollar property was located on the north fork of St Croix Creek some 19 miles northeast of Terrace. The Eagle's Nest claims are located farther to the northwest.

The Copper Dollar and Iron Pot claims were owned in 1914 by J. Brown and J.D. Ross. Trenching was reported.

The Eagle's Nest property was owned in 1914 by Peter Lauzon, of Pitman. Trenching was reported.
