DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

A quartz vein up to 18" wide strikes N40°W and dips 40° NE in diorite of the Coast Intrusions. The vein has been traced for about 200' and at its southeasterly end is cut by a lamprophyre dyke. The quartz contains pyrite. A sample assayed 0.26 oz/t gold and 1.4 oz/t silver. A second conformable vein occurs about 20' higher.

HISTORY OF EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT

The property is located at about 1,700' elevation on the north side of Kleanza Creek some 11 miles northeast of Terrace.

The Golden Era and Chloride claims were owned in 1914 by J.D. Wells and associates, of Kitsalas. Trenching was reported.
