DESCRIPTION OF DEPOSIT/DESCRIPTION DU GISEMENT

The underlying rocks are Triassic (?) sediments and volcanics at the east margin of the Coast Range batholith. Minor copper mineralization occurs in quartz veins from a few inches to 5 feet wide in silicified and pyritized volcanic rocks. Assays gave no values in gold and silver.

Showings are located at elevations of 950 to 1,400' on the west side of the Skeena River, on a small creek immediately north of Lowrie Creek, some 11 miles northeast of Terrace.
